

PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data

1. Introduction

The European Agency for the operational management of large-scale IT systems in the area of freedom, security and justice (hereafter, 'eu-LISA') is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. eu-LISA collects and further processes personal data pursuant to <u>Regulation (EU) 2018/1725</u> of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data

The information in relation to processing operation "External sFTP" undertaken by Corporate Services Unit (CSU) is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

Corporate Services Unit (CSU) collects and uses your personal information to provide sFTP service to the external contractors in order to have the ability to transfer large file(s), which are needed in order to execute them on the appropriate CBS systems in eu-LISA.

Your personal data will *not* be used for an automated decision-making including profiling.

Your personal data processed may be reused for the purpose of procedures before the EU Courts, national courts, or the European Court of Auditors.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data

We process your personal data, because:

(a) processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body.

Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation CSU collects the following categories of personal data:

- First name, last name;
- IP Address.
- Remote Address (Public IP address of the source);
- User Name (User Name of the end user that authenticates on the sFTP application);

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- Date and time of handling by sFTP sever (source: the sFTP system);
- Name of the file transferred (Name of the file that is uploaded to the sFTP server).

We have obtained your personal data from the contractor under which you are providing service to eu-LISA.

4. How long do we keep your personal data?

CSU only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing, namely until the end of the contract of the specific project with eu-LISA. After that period the file may be transferred to the Historical Archives.

When determining the maximum retention periods, the Agency takes also into account possible legal recourses, legal, auditing, archiving and reporting obligations.

5. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to eu-LISA staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

The recipients to which personal data are disclosed are designated eu-LISA staff members and contractors of eu-LISA providing goods and services.

The information we collect will not be given to any third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law.

6. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, rectify or erase your personal data and the right to restrict the processing of your personal data. Where applicable, you also have the right to object to the processing or the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a).

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor.
