It was emphasised that any awareness raising activities will also help to enhance the registration process.</p> <p>The WG expressed its concerns regarding the choice of the words “easier” and “safer” in the posters messages “<i>EES: new, faster and safer procedures for non-EU nationals travelling to Europe</i> or “<i>[...]travelling is about to become easier..[]</i>” which could imply that it was not easy nor safe to travel to the EU before. The Commission explained that the wording was assessed by communication experts and reflects the improvements brought by new</p>

	<p>technology to the border check processes, the reliability of biometrics, etc. The message is to be considered in a broader context; it is also connected to the efficiency of border management in land, sea and air environments. COM will evaluate the suggestions received.</p>
<p>4. Technical Updates (eu-LISA)</p>	<p>Technical updates on the registration process, connectivity and compliance testing (CT) were provided to the Carriers WG by eu-LISA. Regarding the support to carriers and the implementation process, eu-LISA is working to improve the current process and the global support to carriers.</p> <p>The process of “certificate sharing” has been updated. The technical guidelines for system-to-system and web/mobile connection as well as documents for pre-defined carrier test cases for pre-Compliance and Compliance phase, have been revised by eu-LISA and will be shared soon.</p> <p>An overview of the content of the technical guidelines for the VPN making use of standard Secure Internet Protocol and Digital Certificates for secure system-to-system connection was provided. eu-LISA is assessing the impact for the integration of the PSK option proposed by the air carriers, with additional measures as a security requirement. Certain pros and cons for both options were explained during the meeting. eu-LISA strengthened the advantages of certificates vis-à-vis the pre-shared keys, stressing that the needed certificates for production were delivered at 0 cost by eu-LISA (free), the fact that maintenance is easier (renewal period longer than for keys) and, clearly, the higher security. No questions were asked by the participants. The final outcome of the assessment is expected to be provided in the next carrier WG in July.</p> <p>A set of PAXSLT samples were explained. Three scenarios for passengers in transit, intra-Schengen flights, transit flights in Schengen and domestic flights with a Schengen country, were also presented to the WG. The use cases and the application with the Carrier Interface were explained for each scenario.</p> <p>Technical questions from the WG were addressed. During the discussion, reference was made to the duration of the certificates as well as the ICAO and IATA codes.</p>

<p>6. Q&A</p>	<p>The case of Germany and their obligation to collect visa data from passengers was raised. As this is an obligation that derives from national and not EU legal base, COM invited DE to clarify/answer the question.</p> <p>The scenarios presented during the technical updates agenda point were discussed in detail, and use cases involving transit were explained to the WG.</p>
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
